

# DECLARATION OF PEACE


(This document henceforth will be now known as "The Accord")


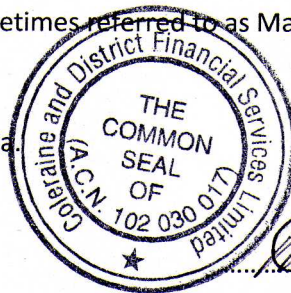
The details of this "Accord" are as follows:
